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Hanging Kitchen Hand Towels With A Button



These towels are not fancy but they work great. The best thing is they cost very little to make so you can have several of them on hand!


Supplies:

1 Package of Face Cloths (WalMart sells a Multi Pack for around \$5 that are perfect)

Fabric & Buttons

This pattern is for ½ inch wide draw handles or a towel holder around a ½ thick. You may need to adjust it to your needs.


Fabric: Cut Two (The size can be adjusted to suit your needs)



2 ½ INCHES
¼ INCH SEAM
ALLOWANCE

8 ½ INCHES
¼ INCH SEAM
ALLOWANCE


Put the two pieces together. You should see the wrong side of the fabric. The sides you want to see are hidden.




Place On Top

Pieces Together

Leaving a ¼ inch seam allowances sew around these 3 sides:




Trim your seam allowances down to about a 1/8 inch. Snip the corners off (close but not too close to the stitch) on the end you sewed shut only. On the end not sewn shut fold the fabric over a ¼ of an inch (when folded you will see the side you want to see) press with an iron. Go all the way around until both sides are done. Turn right side out. Press flat with an iron. On the end that is sewed shut you need to sew a button hole. I eyeball were to put it but you can measure if you like. Sew your button hole. Be sure to set your machine to the right button hole length for the button you want to use. I suggest you create one on scrap fabric to check if the button fits through the hole.



Now pick up your face cloth by the corner using your index finger and your thumb. Can you see the shape in the picture (above –Finished Towel) when you look at yours? Now lay it on a table so that you can adjust the two corners to your liking.

Place the open end of piece you created over the corner you were holding with index finger and your thumb. You want the corners of the piece you created and the edges of the wash cloth to line up. Adjust it so it looks ok. Pin and sew across the edge of the open end.

This point is inside the fabric piece



Now Fold The Piece you created over. Mark were to sew on the button. Sew on your button. Your Done =) Enjoy.
